



Parent Request Form
 To Withhold Name, Address, and Phone Number

The No Child Left Behind Act states that high schools must make student directory information available to military recruiters and colleges. There is an exception to this. Parents may request that this information not be released. School Districts may disclose appropriately designated "directory information" without parents written consent unless parents have advised the school that they do not want their student's information disclosed without their prior written consent.

This federal law requires local educational agencies receiving assistance under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 to provide military recruiters, upon request, with three directory information categories – names, addresses and telephone number.

If you do not want the school to disclose this information from your child's education records without your prior written consent, you must notify the District in writing by the start of school by filling out this form.

If you do not return this form to the high school where your child is enrolled, the school district will disclose the names, addresses and telephone numbers of high school students upon request by military recruiters and institutions of higher learning.
